

Student Guidelines for Colibri Thanksgiving Break November 2019

Student Guidelines and Responsibilities:

1. To comply with all program rules.
2. During the program, students must remain on campus (HI hotel after 10 pm until 8 am) **Students must report the program staff on duty at 10pm. Police will be notified immediately if student is not present check-in. Failure to report for check-in could result in the student's departure from the program.**
3. Before leaving HI hotel building, students MUST notify a program staffer and provide information regarding their destination and expected return time.
4. Students must keep their room and personal belongings neat, clean, and orderly at all times. **NO OPEN FOOD IS ALLOWED IN THE ROOMS.**
5. Students are liable to pay the entire cost for repairs or replacements of damaged property. Students are required to report any potential damage immediately.
6. **The consumption, possession, and/or sale of tobacco, alcohol, and controlled or illegal substances is strictly prohibited. There is a zero tolerance policy for students in violation of this guideline. If in violation, the student(s) involved will be sent home immediately at their own cost.**
7. **The possession of a firearm, blade, explosive, dangerous chemical or weapon is strictly prohibited. There is a zero tolerance policy for students in violation of this guideline. If in violation, the student(s) involved will be sent home immediately at their own cost.**
8. **Male students are not permitted enter female's rooms and females are not permitted to be in the men's rooms. Excessive public displays of affection are disallowed.**
9. **Students are disallowed from engaging in intercourse for the duration of the program. If in violation, the student(s) involved will be sent home immediately at their own cost.**
10. **Student are forbidden from engaging in speech or other expression intended to insult or use of "fighting" words or non-verbal symbols directed at an individual's disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression, nationality, race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, or any other status protected by law which is obscene, libelous or slanderous, or which by their very utterance or expression are likely to incite a violent reaction as to create a clear and present danger of the commission of unlawful acts.**

- 11. Verbal harassment, physical abuse or hazing or engaging in harassing or discriminatory behavior based on disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression, nationality, race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, or any other status protected by law, or the threat of any such physical abuse will not be tolerated.**
- 12. Committing sexual harassment as defined by law or by District policies and procedures, which may include unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal, nonverbal, or physical conduct of a sexual nature.**
- 13. Stalking or repeatedly following or harassing another person through conduct composed of a series of acts that seriously alarm, annoy, torment, or terrorize in a manner that threatens to place that person in reasonable fear for his/her safety or the safety of his/her immediate family.**
- 14. Theft and/or robbery and computer-based crimes are disallowed.**
- 15. Engaging in intimidating conduct or bullying against another person through words or actions, including direct physical contact and verbal assaults**
- 16. Respect and listen to the program staff helping and HI hotel staff.**

Safety Precautions

1. Students should not leave campus alone. They should walk in groups of 2 or more and have a cell phone able to receive calls/texts.
2. Students shall not cause harm to themselves or anybody else for the duration of the program.
3. Students must report all incidents or potential incidents to a program staffer immediately, regardless of the time or situation.
4. Students must call 9-1-1 in the case of an emergency medical issue or contact a program staffer as appropriate.
5. If lost, students must contact a program staffer who will arrange for transport back to the HI Hotel.

I understand that any failure to follow these rules, policies and procedures may result in consequences including, but not limited to, restrictions from camp activities, disciplinary action or immediate dismissal from the program at my own cost. I understand that if dismissed from the Thanksgiving Program for disciplinary reasons, no refund of camp tuition will be granted.
